PASTORAL VISITATION - 14th-15th June 2025

On Sunday 14th-15th June the people of the Cluster of Blessed Peter Wright will have a Pastoral Visitation by the Rt Rev Dr David James Oakley, Bishop of Northampton.

Bishop David will visit the two Catholic parish churches of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, Oundle and of St Paul the Apostle, Thrapston with the chapel of St Thomas More, Raunds.

Many of you might ask: "What is a Pastoral Visitation?" It is a way for a Bishop to come into personal contact with the clergy and especially with the many people responsible for various areas of the pastoral life of the parish. Through this visit the bishop becomes acquainted with the reality of the environment, the socioeconomic condition of the people, the current pastoral programs, and the overall functioning of the parish. It is a time of grace for the entire Catholic community of the area, whose chief pastor visits to bring encouragement and hope to those involved in pastoral work and to all the people of the parish. He will celebrate the Eucharist, proclaim the Word of God and preach the wonders of our wonderful Catholic faith. The bishop visits a parish, which is not a building but rather the people who make it. He will make known the pastoral priorities of the whole diocese and will foster a sense of belonging to the diocesan Church, which is the Local Church of Northampton.

Oundle (and others) Walkers Group

A small group of us from Oundle try to walk (weather permitting) as and when people can manage. It's open to all in the Walkers Whatsapp group to suggest a walk and a day/time for others to join if they can. It's not a regular day, to accommodate those who have regular commitments, and we usually end up somewhere for a coffee, drink and maybe a snack somewhere. Walks may be up to three or four miles, and are commonly at a fairly gentle pace as we are usually chatting! We don't confine ourselves to Oundle and have done places like Aldwincle Country Park and Fermyn Woods in the past.

We're hoping to do the Cotterstock river walk from Oundle next Wednesday (4th June) parking by the Rec opposite Oundle Tyre and Exhaust at 10 am. If you are interested please ask Fr Benedetto for my email address, and I can add you to the group for further details. Elizabeth



Prayer For the Canonisation



15th June 2025 - DAY FOR LIFE

The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. This year it falls on 15 June. The theme is Hope does not Disappoint: Finding meaning in Suffering. It is inspired by Romans 5:5-6. St Paul invites us to see that Christian hope is not just naïve optimism but, rather, an unshakeable trust in the power and presence of God who is with us always. This hope can endure the darkness of human suffering and even see beyond it. Suffering touches every person at some point in their lives. It is often associated with illness, grief, and loss. It is not only caused by physical pain but includes emotional suffering as well as 'soul pain', such as depression and despair. Christians are not immune to this mystery and we often struggle to know how best to respond to it, and where we can find hope. Day for Life is marked on the same day by the three Bishops' Conferences of England and Wales, Scotland, and Ireland.
