RIDE, STRIDE & DRIVE

(formerly known as Ride and Stride!)

A great day out discovering England's churches. Ride, Stride and Drive is the foremost annual fun fund-raising event to help preserve churches and chapels and keep them active in our communities. Ride, Stride and Drive is a sponsored event for cyclists, joggers, walkers and horse riders. Any mode of transport can be used as long as sponsors are happy; this year the name has been changed to **Ride, Stride and Drive** to include older and disabled participants who can drive to different and perhaps more out of the way churches – or anyone who wishes to include visits to more places. Money raised helps **Northamptonshire Historic Churches Trust** to continue supporting our marvellous churches across the county with essential repairs and improvements. **Ride, Stride and Drive** is an opportunity to raise money not only for the Trust but for our own church, as they return 50% of the money to us. Some participants challenge themselves to visit as many churches as they can by their chosen mode of transport. Others prefer a more leisurely approach, visiting fewer churches and taking more time at each. There is no age limit - it is a great family activity – and you plan your own route.
